Azalea Tips from David Knittle's Presentation



If you missed the meeting and love azaleas, you missed much. Dave is a true time tested expert on them. He brought one of Mel Goldstein's collection along with its photographic history. (Dave has worked with Mel on his collection for many years.)

Here are some highlights from his talk:

Work on your azaleas before they bloom

rather than after....let the plant put its energy into new work rather than blooming.

- When starting with stock, work on the development of trunk first. Use sacrifice branches to help you develop a trunk.
- Always leave a stump of branches you remover to prevent die back. This will be removed a few months later and then sealed with a jell or paste.
- Do major pruning when 40 degree nights are assured...same with transplanting.
- You can cut 40 percent of the roots at transplanting.
- Use a three year cycle on developed azaleas:
 - YEAR ONE
 - Use Kamuna soil for the best development of fibrous roots
 - Use a chop stick to remove old soil
 - Remove one or more inches from each side of the root ball by cutting it off with a knife before using the chop stick to remove the other soil. Then replant with Kamuna Soil. Include spores for Mycrorhyrza
 - Add in your nutrients like iron, fertilizer, and micronutrients.
 - Use Yamgoke Moss (Mountain Moss) on the surface on the soil to keep plants moist and encourage nebari development (David uses this on all his bonsai) Soak



the moss and press it into the surface of the dry soil. Leave on all year unless using your tree in a soil.

- Water with one of the transplant solutions.
- Do not allow the tree to bloom...keep the energy for development instead.
- Use fish/algae fertilizer sprayed directly on the leaves once a week. Heavily fertilize the tree for maximum development.
- Provide fertilizer cakes....use more than you would normally.
- If you use a regular stone mix for soil remember that they do not hold fertilizer so you must push the fertilizer even more
- In late September carefully thin the foliage from 4 or 5 sets to 2 sets on each new growth stem.
- Using your finger nail, thin flower buds down to one per cluster.

YEAR TWO

- Remove Mountain Moss and some surface soil.
- Clear small surface fibrous roots off to expose larger nebari (surface roots) Use a plastic brush and scissors to do this.
- Add in small amount of replacement top soil and replace the moss.
- In spring cut each flower shoot and its leaves by 60% each.
- Fertilize as before all season.

YEAR THREE

- Same, except if developed as you wish, you may allow it to flower BUT be sure to keep the amount of flowering under control.
- Remove flowers immediately as they begin to wilt.
- Repeat this cycle every three years to create one of these:
