August Field Trip Workshop and Show & Tell

Our August 24-25 club activity comes in two parts: a field trip and workshop at New England Bonsai Gardens on Saturday followed on Sunday with a show & tell session presented by the workshop attendees.

On Saturday August 24, we'll travel to New England Bonsai Gardens and attend a workshop with John Romano. NEBG is located in Bellingham, MA and features eight greenhouses and an extensive bonsai garden shop. They are recognized as one of the nation's largest, most beautiful and comprehensive bonsai nurseries. John Romano has been teaching bonsai classes and private students at New England Bonsai Gardens since 2000. He heads the Kaikou School of Bonsai, a two year intensive program of bonsai study and practice.

There will be 8 workshop spots available. The workshop cost is \$50 plus the cost of material (estimated at \$125 to \$150). Attendees will chose from assortment of shohin-sized junipers and Japanese black pines that have been selected especially for us.

We will drive over to Bellingham to arrive at NEBG around 10:00a and spend about an hour touring the gardens and bonsai shop. NEBG has generously offered a 10% discount on purchases made that day from the greenhouses or bonsai garden shop.

The workshop with John Romano will begin at noon and run until about 3:00p. Attendees should bring their own tools including wire, and also pack their own lunch, snacks, and beverages.

Then, on Sunday after our club meeting and brunch, workshop attendees will share their workshop learnings and experiences, their trees and purchases at a show & tell session for fellow club members.

Final details are still being worked out at this time. We also hope to work out carpooling arrangements once we have heard from interested club members.

Bonsai Calendar by Dave Hodgetts

July Outdoors

As temperatures rise, watering and shade management become ever more important. When possible, check trees every 3-4 hours during the day. A layer of sphagnum moss on the soil surface helps prevent it from drying out quite so fast and both 30% shade cloth and direct shading also help. Direct shading of the pots can also prevent temperature-related root damage. Warm and windy days are especially demanding and shelter from the wind can help.

Water each tree until it comes out the drain holes. If water pools on the soil surface or runs right off, water must be allowed to sink in and then rewatered as many times as necessary. Automated watering systems may have a role in certain circumstances, but are no substitute for hand watering. Automated systems may also be prone to unanticipated gremlins, with potentially catastrophic results.

Larch continue to push new growth. On refined trees, the new growth can simply be pinched in half once it reaches 1-1/2 to 2" inches long. On trees in development, leave the new growth to harden off. At that point buds are visible, and you can choose between cutting back to an opposing pair of buds, which will typically result in a bifurcation, or cutting back to a bud pointing in the direction you want the branch to grow.

The second flush of growth on broad-leaved deciduous material can be pruned back to two leaves when hardened off utilizing directional pruning. To increase light reaching inner foliage, each remaining outer leaf may be cut in half. On Japanese maples, one of each pair of outer leaves is typically removed. Rotate each tree periodically to permit equal sun exposure.

Remove inner foliage on junipers that has yellowed and died. Extending foliage tips, or lion's tails, can be cut back, being careful to leave some of this year's foliage at each branch tip.

Tropicals can be repotted as they hit mid-summer dormancy.

In general, fertilization continues, as determined by the tree's species and developmental status. The application of antifungals is discontinued for July, although they remain on hand for use as needed. Insecticide application continues.

As Pauline used to say, Keep growing.
