## Bonsai by Month by Dave Hodgetts

### September (Early Autumn)

The shade cloth is removed in September as the risk of sunburn on delicate foliage and of root damage due to high pot temperatures diminishes.

Watering continues as needed, with demand tending to decrease with the temperature.

Routine NPK pellet fertilization and kelp foliar feeding continue until mid-September, (approximately one month before the average first frost date, October 12th @ DJH). Applying feed after this is simply wasteful, as the trees will not utilize it during dormancy.

The theory that giving nitrogen late in the growing season stimulated growth that would not have time to harden off before the frost came, killing that growth and possibly endangering the entire tree, has been debunked. In fact, new late growth on deciduous species results from pruning too late, which is why we typically make the last cut back on these species in July. Giving nitrogen, as part of a balanced feeding regimen, late in the season does not induce new growth and is beneficial, as it helps prepare the tree for spring.

At DJH no prophylactic fungicide this month, but Mancozeb is applied, if necessary, for tip blight on Juniper, Thuja or Chamaecyparis. Tip blight often presents once the temperatures drop into the 45 to 50 degree F range. Cedar-Apple rust galls may also appear on Junipers around this time and should be removed. Malathion spray is applied as a prophylactic insecticide.

Taxus/Yew in development should undergo old needle removal in late September/early October, as the temperature drops and the old, inner foliage begins to yellow. The foliage on the last 1.5 to 2.0 inches of each branch tip is left in place and old inner "needles" are removed, being careful not to damage any existing buds. This process, coupled with the use of relatively high nitrogen (N > 10) feed, will result in impressive back budding and increased foliage volume next year.

Mid-September through October is good time for scion grafting on pines and the best time to perform wedge cuts, heavy wiring/bending on pine species.
